
DoveTales





Pastor's Message:

Welcome to the first issue of the bi-monthly newsletter entitled "Dovetales!" This metaphorical title and play on words is born of the symbol that we have peppered throughout our church grounds and in our various publications, the dove! In scripture, the dove is portrayed as an animal of peace, and, perhaps, most iconically, when Jesus is baptized, the gospel of Luke says that "the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus in bodily form like a dove." It is also the bird that returns to Noah with a sprig of tree, communicating to Noah and the family that the flood waters had subsided. The dove is a symbol of peace and the bringer of good news!

Lent at Prince of Peace

Lent is coming! Ash Wednesday this year beautifully coincides with everyone's favorite Hallmark Holiday, Valentine's Day! This most fortunate collision of calendars will provide for us rich fodder to ponder both our mortality (remember that you are dust) and also the depths of love that we can experience when we let go of our fears and learn to love fully. Join us for the imposition of ashes at either worship service, 11AM or 7:30PM.

You can worship with us in the evening and then enjoy time with your beloveds with ashes on your head, proudly proclaiming that you are neither afraid of love nor death! © In all seriousness, if this is your first or one of many Ash Wednesdays that you have experienced, it is a powerful entrance into one of the holiest and most profound times of faith exploration. As you prepare for Lent, we encourage you to "take on" a spiritual practice for the season, based on your own physical, spiritual, or emotional needs. Perhaps you want to recommit to Bible study, or take special care about how you are spending money by limiting your purchases to only buying items for others. Perhaps you are feeling the strain of cold and flu season and want to walk or commit to a daily fitness routine. Each of these



ideas are part of a broader vision of understanding ourselves as holistic and cherished children of God. If you are interested in more ideas or exploring this conversation in anticipation of Lent, your local pastors are theological specialists in this time of year.

SOUP AND SALAD SUPPERS

We will gather on Wednesday evenings for soup and salad suppers. We will eat at 6PM, worship with the music of Holden Evening Prayer, and spend time in conversation and relationship building as part of that worship. Two New Initiatives to Serve Homeless Among Us

"Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Matthew 25:40

With the end of the rotating men's shelter in December a Social Ministry task force has been actively seeking new ways to sustain and expand Prince of Peace's ministry to the homeless. If you attended the January 14 and 28 FED discussions you heard about the task force's proposals to launch two new initiatives to support this everincreasing, underserved population.

WINTER SHELTER MEALS

As a continuation of our long-standing meal service ministry to those in need, Prince of Peace has agreed to provide dinner for 50 guests at the Trinity Church winter shelter in Mountain View on three Mondays: January 29, February 26, and March 26. Since the shelter will close mid-April, the task force is also exploring additional meal opportunities that will continue our commitment into the rest of the year.

SAFE PARK

The task force is also exploring establishing a rotating evening safe park program at Prince of Peace in collaboration with other local churches. Hosting no more than 15 vehicles for a month at a time, the safe park would provide a secure evening respite for families and individuals living in their cars. The task force has been working with local government agencies and faith-based organizations and hopes to open the shelter in late spring.
